Training – Doug is an ordained Pastor in the Presbyterian Church (USA). He is a certified coach for new pastors within the Presbyterian Church (USA); a certified people map trainer; a certified pastoral care specialist; and has completed training in the Palmetto Health Center for Clergy and Congregations; Congregational Leadership Initiative.

Vocational Journey – Doug has served Presbyterian Church (USA) congregations in Chicago, IL; Morrisville, PA; Greenville, SC; Moore, SC; and Leland, NC. For the past 15 years, Doug has served as a PCUSA certified coach for new churches and church planters. He has coached and consulted church planting projects in Minnesota; Ohio; Georgia; Tennessee and the Carolinas. He has taught about his experiences in church planting in Baghdad, Iraq; Columbia Theological Seminary and Denver Theological Seminary.
